ANNE B. ZILL TO MOUNT EXHIBITION OF PHOTOGRAPHS BY
AMERICAN WOMEN ARTISTS
AT UNESCO IN PARIS

Anne B. Zill, director of the University of New England (UNE) Art Gallery and president of the non profit Center for Ethics in Action (CEIA) also located at UNE, has been invited by the Educational and Cultural arm of the UN, UNESCO, to mount an exhibition of 35 photographs by American women artists in Paris during March, 2011, Women's History Month.

There will be an Opening Reception at UNESCO beginning at 6 p.m. on March 8, International Women's Day for *Women at Work, Women's Lives*.

On March 10, from 3-5:30 p.m. she will conduct an Educational Symposium at UNESCO with three of the artists represented in the exhibition, Barbara Goodbody, Maine fine arts photographer, Paola Gianturco, author of *Celebrating Women* and *Women Who Light the Dark*, and Donna DeCesare, University of Texas professor of Documentary Photography and Fulbright Fellowship winner. They will discuss how they came as artists to focus upon women's lives, some of the subjects they address, and their different approaches and techniques. They will also offer some of the stories behind the images in the UNESCO exhibition that illuminate the current state of women and girls around the world today – both progress made and the challenges that remain.

This will be the third exhibition Zill has mounted under the auspices of CEIA – focused upon women's leadership-- at a United Nations organization. She is pleased to include five photographs by artists on behalf of Women for Women International. The show will continue on display at UNESCO in Paris through March 25.
